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### Helping Young Children Learn Language

Young children have time to learn through play-like activities. They pick up language by taking part in an activity shared with an adult. They firstly make sense of the activity and then get meaning from the adult's shared language. Young children have more time to fit English into the daily programme.

### How young children learn English as another language ...

Create a daily structure and routines to help children learn what to expect. Share information with parents of returning children about how daily routines might be different because of the COVID-19 pandemic, and how to help prepare their child for any changes. Provide frequent communication to parents about their children's time in the program.

### COVID-19 pandemic: Helping young children and parents ...

There are many ways to support young children in learning to share. Here are a few suggestions to try. Some approaches may work better than others, depending on the situation and your child: Ensure safety. When young children feel threatened (like when a friend tries to snatch their toy!), they often respond in an aggressive way.

### Helping Young Children With Sharing • ZERO TO THREE

Children need specific suggestions and demonstrations from adults in order to learn that there are effective ways to handle disagreements that are more acceptable than physical attack and retaliation. Use language. If your child has language skills, help him explain what he is angry about.

Young children need to learn the ways of speaking in the day care center or school where, for example, teachers often ask rhetorical questions. Learning pragmatic rules is as important as learning the rules of the other components of language, since people are perceived and judged based on both what they say and when they say it.
